



Requirements for Geotechnical Engineering and Construction Materials Engineering & Testing (CMET) for Firms Working on Houston Public Works' Projects



Houston Public Works (HPW) has certain requirements for firms to satisfy before they can perform Geotechnical Engineering projects and/or receive Construction Materials Engineering & Testing (CMET) contracts. These requirements are as follows:

- Submitting HPW 100 form to the Houston Public Works once every two years;
- Having active accreditation by American Association for Laboratory Accreditation (A2LA);
- Being managed by a full-time Professional Engineer registered in the state of Texas; and
- Having CMET technicians certified by agencies approved by the HPW.

Houston Public Works will process CMET contract for a new firm once a year provided the above requirements are fulfilled by the firm, and the request for the new contract is received prior to September 30th of the year.
